RALLY REPORTS

CAMPING ON THE BATTENKILL – July 23-26, 2015 – Hosts Steve and Sara Bernheisel – Rally report by Michael V

Camping on the Battenkill is a lovely privately owned campground in southern Vermont. We camped in the large rally field which is adjacent to the river, nice wide camping spaces. Steven B and I caravanned up a day early making it safely but what a long drive...nearly 10 hours. The weather when we arrived was so perfect, while it was in the 90s and a swamp in DC it was low 70s with nearly no moisture in the air...just lovely.

We were a small group, 6 trailers and a motorhome. We had a blast. Thursday was spent organizing ourselves, setting up camp and figuring out where we would all hang out. Steven and Sara were first time rally hosts...so I helped a little bit. We set up between my trailer and theirs with two portable pavillion tents...we ended up needing them as it rained briefly each day. Folks arrived for the most part by late Thursday afternoon with one family arriving on Friday.

There were lots of activities, eating out was a favorite as there are a number of great inns and small restaurants in Bennington and Arlington Vermont. I had probably the best blue cheese burger ever in Arlington! There was a car show at Hemmings which several folks went to, the report back was that it was great for those unfamiliar with car shows but just a bit better than average for others. Many of us went to Bennington to visit Bennington Pottery. Interestingly this pottery is a traditional potter, set up in a former farm supply store in the mid 1950s at the zenith of American pottery production. I've been a collector of a particular California pottery for more years than I care to admit and have original factory photographs from that potter's factory. I was amazed that Bennington was set up in exactly the same way! Their product is all hand made with only the assistance of heavy machinery. It was just awesome to be given a real behind the scene tour, to see exactly how each piece is made from the pug mill to the kiln. Many of us went to tour the plant and we all ended up taking home some great ware.

Part of Saturday was spend in Arlington, antiquing and visiting the famous bookstore, yes one still exists, where many a book was purchased. The little town is quite beautiful. The highlight of Arlington for many of us was the doormen at the Equinox Hotel, a 5+ star hotel on the edge of town...those poor guys have to wear knee high tan and black argyle socks and black knickers to work every day! We later found out the hotel also hosts a fairly famous golf course :)

Probably the most stunning activity was the drive up the the summit of Mount Equinox, about a 3,500 foot climb to the top. The summit can be hiked too but we all drove. It is about a 30 minute drive up a very steep and hairpin turned road. At the summit is a beautiful heavy timber with exposed hand joinery visitor's center. Oddly (to me at least) this structure replaced one of the first International Style (an architectural term) commercial structures built in Vermont...the Equinox Inn. There is a bit of the history of the Inn as well as the history of the mountain itself. We spent a nice early afternoon up there and enjoyed the views immensely.

Our main meals were hosted by Sara and Steven and included catered BBQ from a organic farm raised pork that was locally grown...great stuff. Breakfast was healthy with locally made donuts (no one could get enough), locally baked bagels and an assortment of fruits, yogurt and cereals. All in all Sara and Steven did an AMAZING job hosting their first rally and I know all of us are hoping they will get us all back up to Vermont in the years to come.

Of special note for me personally was a gift left for me in my trailer. I waited to open it until I got home since it was addressed to both Sean and I. I wanted him to see what it was. When I opened it I was shocked as it turned out to be an original painting done by Sharleen Field. It is actually a pen and ink drawing that is painted over with water color. The image is of the tenant house/slave from Compton Bassett after our group cleanup during CKR in 2013. The painting is just lovely and I will always treasure it. The painting was given to us as a wedding present from Sharlene...just the best.

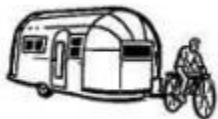
